Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Support

I continue to forward (and/or facilitate) adjunct faculty inquiries regarding specific curriculum, instruction, and assessment issues to the respective Division Chairs. This is being done systematically in an effort to facilitate improved interdepartmental communication and collaboration. The most recent questions have been related to confusion about Core Assignments and questions regarding the upcoming End of Term procedures.

I provided minor assistance to Derek Sandoval in locating a SACS qualified instructor for Spanish. I provided minor assistance to Abel Ortiz (requested by him) in locating adjuncts in his Division for End of Term preparations. I have also provided Abel Ortiz with historical information regarding the End of Term procedures used for both History and Government for assessment of Course Outcomes and Core Outcomes.

This focused assistance stemmed from the repeated student disruptions in her class observed during my two class visits. The student disruptions (and the first corrective actions taken) were reported previously and I am listing the aforementioned additional corrective action taken as a situational awareness follow-up to Academic Affairs.
